The Second Adam

In Year 7 RE, students have been tackling the rich yet perplexing texts of Genesis' creation stories by tackling both Chapter One and Two. It has been an insightful way to help us understand how to read the Bible. We have learnt that especially in the case of Genesis it reads very similarly to a poem and a romantic story where God's ultimate love is illustrated to us at the very conception of our creation. Whilst Darwin's theory of evolution takes precedent in understanding how we came to be as animals the Genesis story still informs us of God's lasting promise. Indeed, as mentioned in Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians as well as hinted in the second chapter of Genesis we are told of the coming of a "Second Adam", Jesus Christ: God's promise that he is with us, always. This radical love and this theme of Genesis' promise of Jesus' coming begins at Christmas. This is why we have run in 7N a Christmas card competition to fuse these narratives together and to highlight of the foretelling of Jesus found in Genesis. A real gap in the Christmas card market!

7N came up with some astonishingly detailed and beautiful cards which showed the birth of The Son of Man in this light. Mr Fusi, our lay chaplain, was on duty to judge these cards. It was tough competition but I am delighted to share that (in no particular order) Hettie, Noah, Ava and Sherise came out as joint champions. A chocolatey prize awaits them! A special mention to also Nico, Anaiah, Rezin And Esther for their wonderful contributions.










Book Of The Week



1 - Windrush Child by Benjamin Zephaniah

Windrush Child by Benjamin Zephaniah, who sadly passed away recently at the age of 65.

Benjamin was an award winning writer, poet, actor and musician of Jamaican heritage.

This is the story of Leonard, who at 10 years old makes the journey with his mother from Jamaica to join his father in England. Leonard is part of the Windrush generation, one of thousands of people who were persuaded by the government to help rebuild England after the Second World War, and to make a better life for themselves. Benjamin Zephaniah draws on his own experience of growing up in Britain in the 1960s to describe the difficulties Leonard and his family face: the freezing English weather, the awful food and the extremely unwelcoming people. The story begins by focusing on Leonard's childhood, but follows him all the way to 2018 when he is denied citizenship in the country he has lived in all his life: a tragic example of the Windrush scandal.


