# Attention Year 7 & Year 8 students and parents/carers Sparx Reader is coming!

We're excited to let you know that we've partnered with Sparx to start using their new reading platform: Sparx Reader. Year 7 and Year 8 are going to be using the platform as part of a limited trial period. Our goal with this trial is to enhance our students' reading ability and engagement with reading.

From 26th January 2024, your child will be using **Sparx Reader** to complete weekly homework to read for 30 minutes. Your child's homework will be set on **Friday at 9.00 am** and due the following **Friday at 8.00 am** every week.

Sparx Reader helps every student to achieve regular independent reading, which is incredibly important for building the vital literacy skills needed to access KS3 curriculums and GCSE exam papers in every subject.





### **Numeracy Challenge**




