








## **Book Of The Week**

## **Extra support for families**


Extra support for families are very excited to be bringing their new ADHD and Emotional Regulation workshops to Colchester this September!


Last year's winners were John 11D, Rimante 10T, Antony 9D and Fiifi 8E

Tutor group winners of last term's quiz were 7D now 8D, 8E now 9E, 9T now 10T and 10E now 11E.


